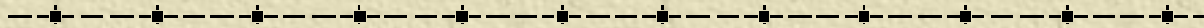


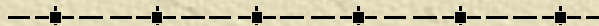

*TallahasseeVoices is a pro bono Internet survey panel sponsored by Kerr & Downs Research and The Tallahassee Democrat. There were 839 responses to the survey sent out on February 3, 2006. Panel results have been weighted to reflect the demographics of Leon County and results are representative of all local residents who have access to the Internet at home, work, or school.



Why this survey now...?

Friday, January 27, 2006—U.S. newspapers announced that Palestinian voters had finally decided on a democratically-elected leadership, just as the Bush administration had been urging...

Why this survey now...?

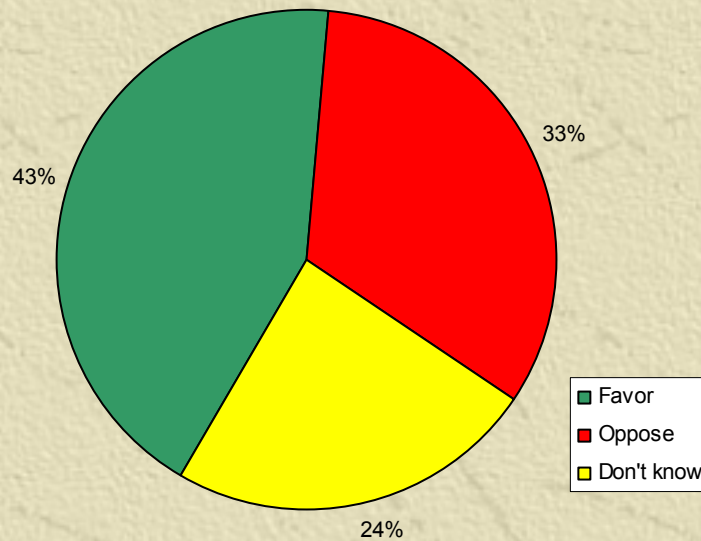
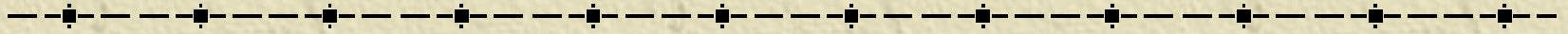

In light of the circumstances, it seemed a good time to ask the city for their opinion.

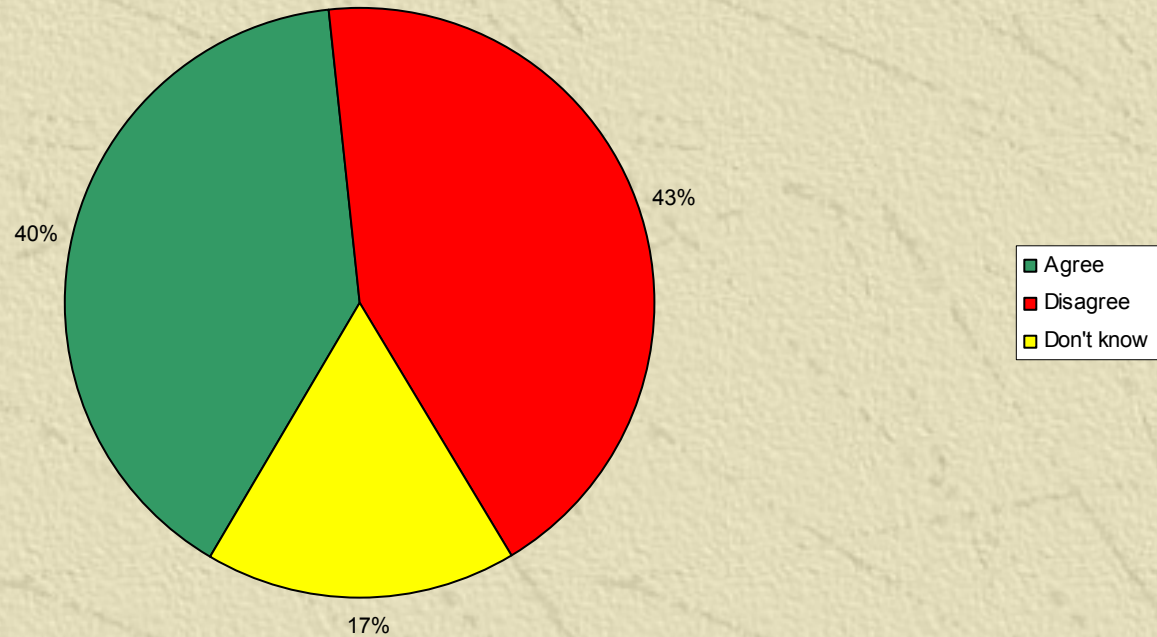
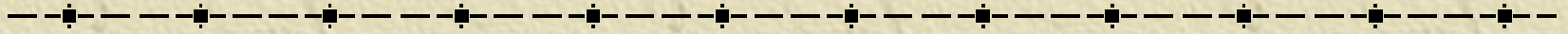
Why this survey now...?

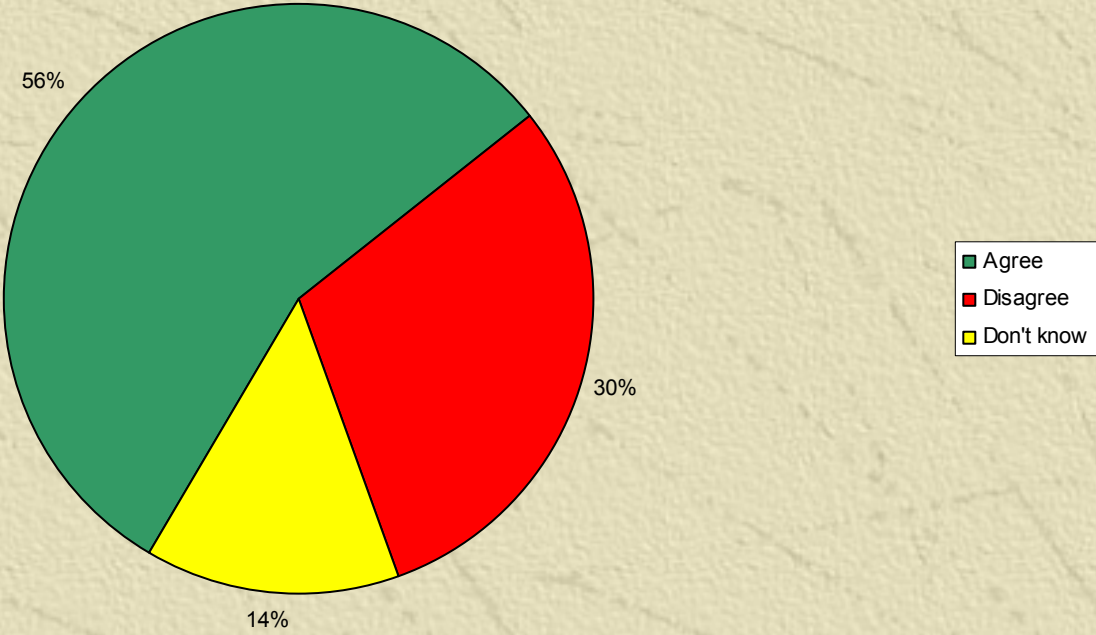
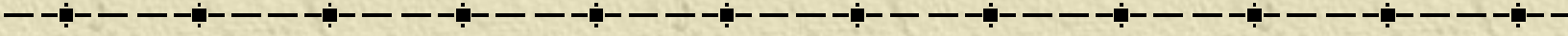
Do you favor or oppose the U.S. establishing formal relations with Hamas, the new Palastinian leadership?



To promote democracy in the Middle East, the Bush administration should establish a formal relationship with Hamas, even though their stated goal is to eliminate Israel.

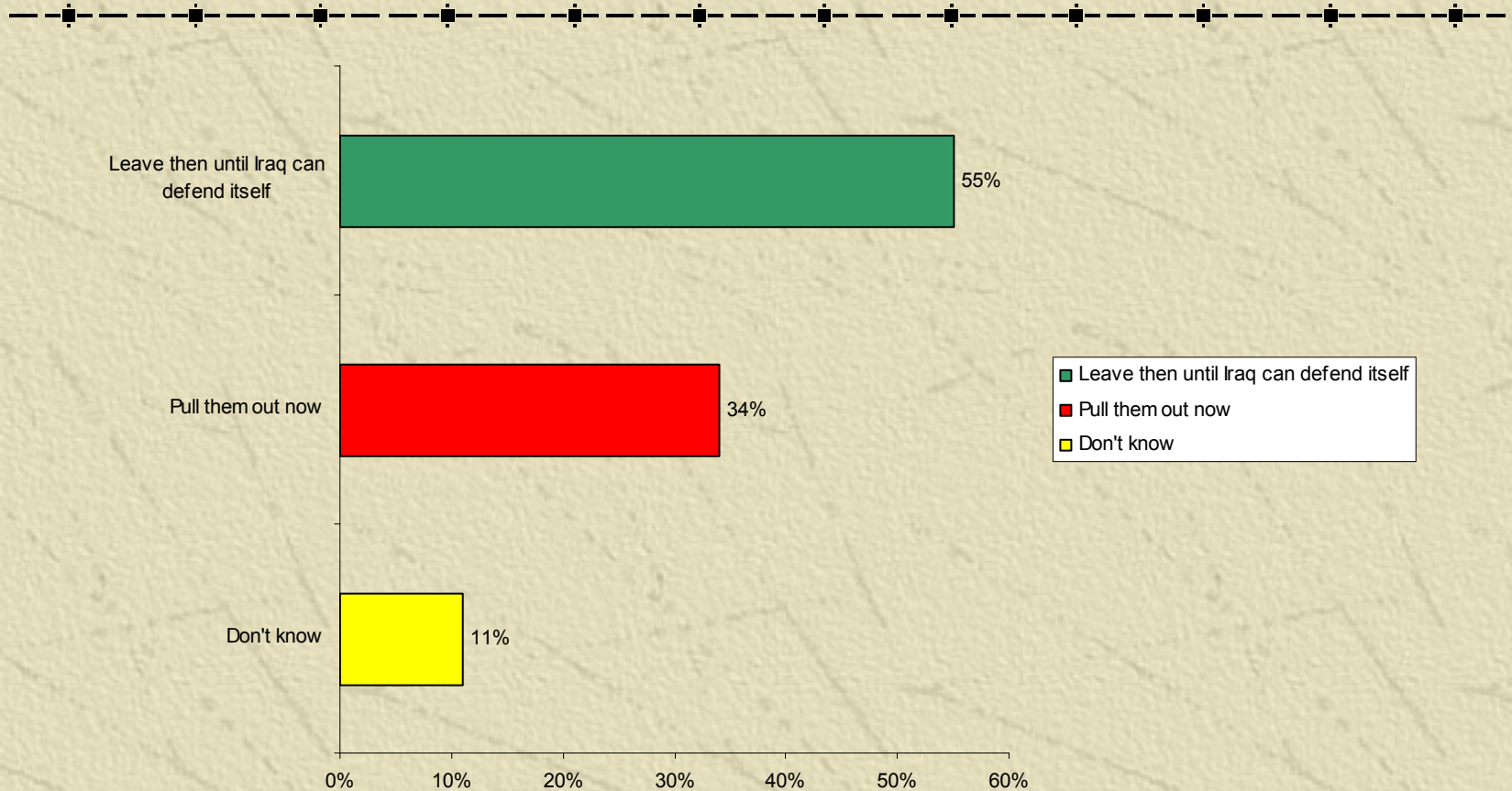


The Bush administration should establish a formal relationship with Hamas only if Hamas recognizes Israel's right to exist.

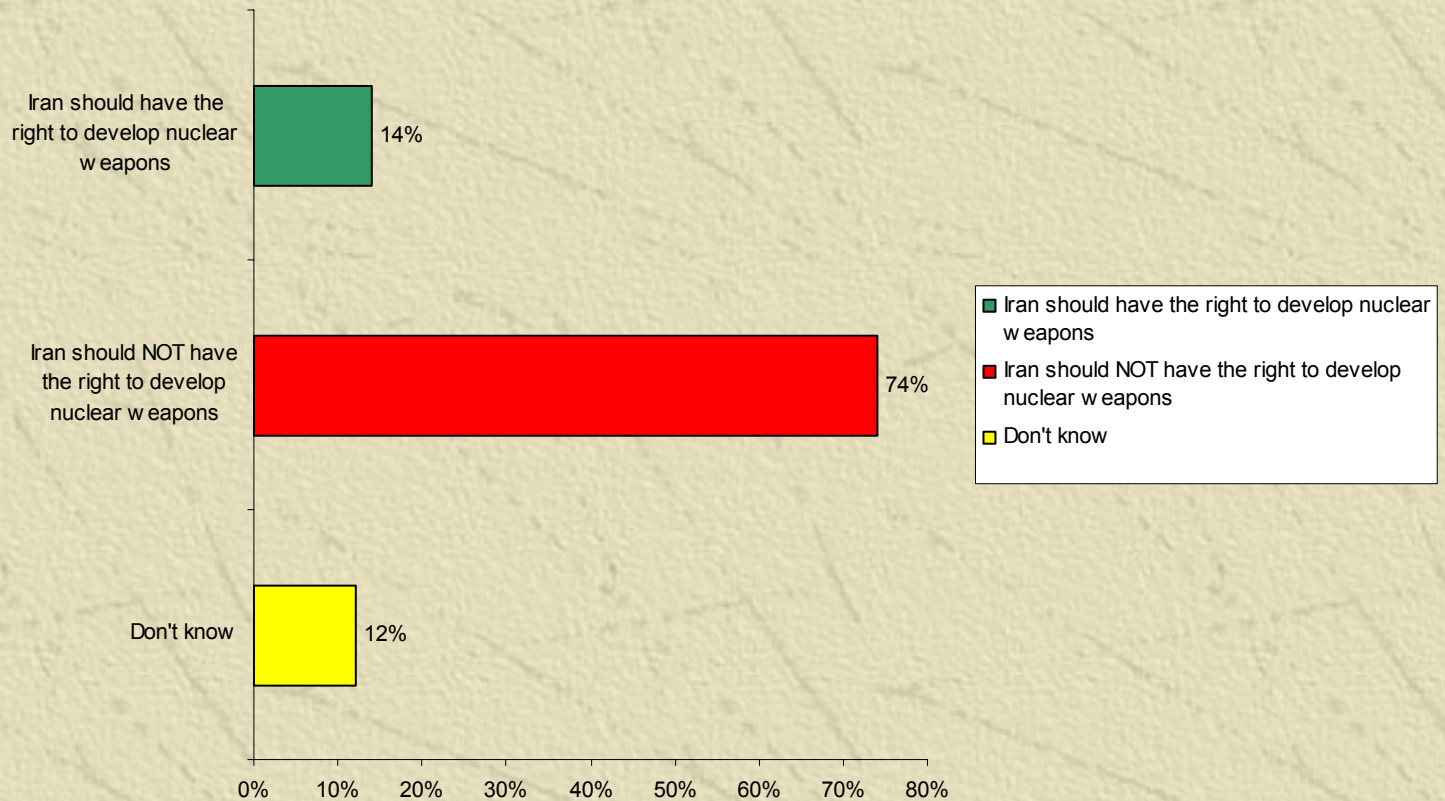
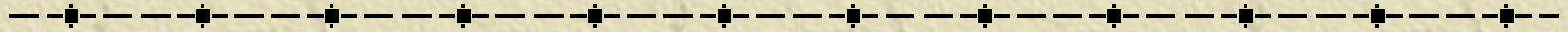


Some people believe the U.S. should pull all of its troops out of Iraq immediately and let the Iraqis defend their own democracy from the insurgencies. Other people
