*TallahasseeVoices* is a pro bono internet survey panel sponsored by

This survey was conducted in December 2013.  
457 panelists responded to the survey.

Results were weighted to reflect the demographics of the 90%+ local residents who have access to the Internet at home, work, or school.

# Economic State of Tallahassee Households

The economic present is much brighter than the past several years for most Tallahassee households, yet there is guarded optimism about the economic future.

In 2013, fewer Tallahassee residents lost jobs or had pay or benefits cut compared to the 4 preceding years.

Fewer households in 2013 suffered negative lifestyle changes such as eating out less often, postponing vacations and vehicle purchases, buying fewer clothes, and delaying home repairs.

While half of local residents expect their income to increase in 2014, only 13% believe the local economy has returned to normal.

2010 was the worst year for local residents as over half of our households lost jobs or had pay, hours or benefits cut; only 15% suffered this fate in 2013.

Despite improvement in the economic state of Tallahassee households since 2010, 4 in 10 local residents report their net worth has declined in the past few years.

Leon County's unemployment rate was at or above 8% for half of 2010, peaking at 8.8% in July with over 13,500 unemployed.

At the end of 2013 unemployment was 5.3%.

# Household Economic Suffering

# Household Income

Compared to the previous year, what is your household income this year?

	2009	2010	2011	2013
Less than last year	37%	41%	35%	27%
Same as last year	28%	34%	38%	33%
Greater than last year	35%	25%	27%	40%

- 4 in 10 households in Tallahassee earned more money in 2013 than in 2012. This represents the best year-to-year increase in the past 4 years.

# Household Income

Compared to the this year, what do you expect your household income to be next year?

	2009	2010	2011	2013
Less than this year	38%	29%	25%	15%
Same as this year	28%	46%	38%	36%
Greater than this year	24%	26%	37%	49%

- The mood in Tallahassee is optimistic for 2014 as half of households expect to earn more money next year than they did in 2013.
- There has been a steady increase in optimism regarding household earning power as the percentage of households that expect to earn more money in the coming year has increased steadily from only 24% in 2009 to 49% in 2013.

# Lifestyle changes

Did the great recession usher in a “new normal?”

- 1 in 2 Tallahasseeans still eat out less often based on the economic reality following the recession
- 1 in 3 buy fewer clothes
- 1 in 3 buy cheaper food
- 2 in 10 have eliminated 1 or more vacations
- 1 in 7 postponed a vehicle purchase




